

Birds & Mammals seen at Chitwan National Park, Nepal.

25th to 30th April 1989

Group Members: Paul Jepson (Leader), Bob Frewin, John & Jean Poulton.

Itinerary.

25th May. Early morning departure from Kathmandu arriving at Gaida Wildlife Camp for lunch. Elephant briefing at 3pm followed by a late afternoon elephant ride into the forest and grasslands across the Rapti River.

26th May. Pre-breakfast birding around Gaida compound. Morning journey down the Rapti river and then by foot to Gaida's tented camp. After lunch driving by jeep to the Gharial breeding centre, returning via Lami Lake in the late afternoon.

27th May. Pre-breakfast birding in the immediate environs of the Gaida camp. After breakfast walked through a variety of forest and grassland types back to the main camp, passing along side Jaimenazala village. Late afternoon birding in the forested compound of Gaida Wildlife camp, and along the river east of this.

28th May. Pre-breakfast birding around Gaida. Morning walk to Hazari Tal and the ~~nearby~~ forest area and then transfer to Chitwan Jungle Lodge. Evening bird walk from the lodge.

29th May. Early morning elephant ride southwards into the park. Morning walk through the forest around the lodge followed by an evening elephant ride.

30th May. Transfer from Chitwan Jungle Lodge to the road and then drive back to Kathmandu arriving at approximately 3.30pm.

Key.

The following symbols are used to denote the approximate area where we saw each species. These symbols are prefixed by a letter which represents our observed relative abundance. These are as follows:

- A = abundant, C = common, S = Scarce, R = Rare
- G = Gaida Wildlife Camp including the adjoining forest, grassland, and adjoining habitats.
- R = Rapti River.
- T = The forest and grassland habitats around the tented camp including Hazari Tal,
- C = Chitwan Jungle Lodge.
