

LIMOSA HOLIDAYS: NEPAL TOUR REPORT 13-25 FEBRUARY 1994

Day 1: Sunday 13 Feb. Depart Gatwick with Royal Nepal 20.00hrs.

Day 2: Monday 14 Feb. Arrive Kathmandu c16.00hrs (via Frankfurt and Dubai where palm Dove and Common Myna are first birds). Sunny and pleasantly warm; cool evening. Met by Bharat & Tika for transfer to Hotel Himalaya, where some good introductory birding in hotel garden and 'swamp'. (31sp)

Day 3: Tuesday 15 Feb. Cool foggy start. Hot & sunny later. Chilly evening. Full day Nagajung Forest Park, with some of party visiting Swayambunath — the Monkey Temple late afternoon. (74sp)

Day 4: Wednesday 16 Feb. Cold, foggy start. Warm, clear & sunny later. Full day visit to Phulchowki, with drive to within a few kms of summit then walk to top and back. Late afternoon at Godaveri Botanical Gardens. (74sp)

Day 5: Thursday 17 Feb. Foggy start. Hot & sunny later. Morning visit to Pashupatinath Temple with walk through to Kathmandu airport for lunchtime internal flight to Biratnagar. 3 hour drive west from Biratnagar to Kosi Tapu Camp which we found to be excellent. (100sp)

Day 6: Friday 18 Feb. Hot and sunny. A moderate-strong SW wind picked up in the afternoon. Pre-breakfast birdwalk at Kosi camp (06.30-08.30), then 17km drift downstream on Kosi river in two inflatables. Some of journey had to be completed on foot as increasing SW cancelled out flow of river! Return to camp by landrover at nightfall. (135sp)

Day 7: Saturday 19 Feb. Hot & sunny. Moderate SW breeze again picked up mid afternoon. Drive from camp-Kosi barrage, where throngs of wildfowl and back via fields and backroads (08.00-18.00). Our 'biggest' day. (168sp)

Day 8: Sunday 20 Feb. Hot, sunny ...and dusty. Full day drive from Kosi camp via the barrage (spent rather too much of the morning birding this area), to Hetauda and finally reaching Machan Lodge in Royal Chitwan NP about 19.00. Had to endure... and participate in native dancing (just the job after full day banging about inside the bus) before being allowed to shower and eat. Dur Illlonnngest day! (123sp)

Day 9: Monday 21 Feb. Hot and humid today. Sunny, with showers late afternoon onwards. Pre-breakfast birdwalk (07-09.00hrs) near lodge, then rest of day on foot (10.15-18.00) in jungle. (120sp)

Day 10: Tuesday 22 Feb. After overnight rain, a cool, foggy and decidedly 'drippy' start to the day. Clearing by 09.00, then hot and sunny. early breakfast then drive to Hetauda for successful interlude with Ibisbill. Lunchtime departure for Gaida Wildlife Lodge (Chitwan), with afternoon elephant ride (15.30-17.30) - one of the highspots. Two saw Leopard, all saw many CLOSE Indian Rhinoceros! Overnight Gaida. (102sp)

Day 11: Wednesday 23 Feb. Hot & sunny. Clear first thing to give ace mountain views. Pre-breakfast elephant ride for some, birdwalk at lodge for others (06.30-07.30). Post-breakfast by dug-out canoe down Rapti river then on foot and by jeep to Jungle Camp (lunch - what else but goulash!). Afternoon walk back through jungle and grasslands to Gaida Lodge. (131sp)

Day 12: Thursday 24 Feb. Hot & sunny again. Pre-breakfast birding at Gaida lodge, then part-walk/part-drive to coach. Drive via Bharatpur-Mugling with some riverside birding stops, then on to Hotel Himalaya, Kathmandu. Much of brand new highway washed away by last monsoon. Late afternoon doing the tourist/souvenir bit (16.30-18.30). Farewell dinner at the hotel. (93sp)

Day 13: Friday 25 Feb. 06.00 breakfast at hotel. 07.00 check-in at airport for 09.00 flight Kathmandu-Gatwick (via Dubai/Frankfurt). End Gatwick 19.00

Small numbers daily at Kosi including the camp swamp. Also Rapti River 23/2 A few daily at Kosi. 1 Machan 21/2. Seen daily at Kosi where peak day count 100+ on 19/2. Also Chitwan 22/2 Scarce. 2 Kosi 19/2; 1+ Kosi barrage 20/2; singles at Chitwan 21/2 & 23/2. Noted on 6 dates from 17/2. Peak day counts 24 Kosi 17/2; 25 Machan 21/2. B+ Kosi 18/2, with 5 seen there 19/2. Small numbers daily at Kosi 17-20/2. 2 at Gaida 22-23/2.

Only at Kosi where max c100 18/2. Seen daily from 17/2, with peak count 40+ Kosi 18/2 and 12 Gaida 23/2. Seen daily at Kosi with max c20 18/2. 3 flying Kosi River 19/2.

Recorded only at Kosi where min. day counts of 300+ on 19-20/2.

Noted daily from 17/2. Peaks of 50+ Kosi River 18/2; 30 Machan 21/2 and 30+ Gaida 23/2.

2 Kosi barrage 19/2 and 20/2. 85+ Kosi barrage lagoons 21/2. Chly at Kosi where max 100+ on 19/2. Duck & drake Kosi barrage 19/2. Only at Kosi where 'hundreds' at the barrage 19/2.

Seen daily at Kosi where peak of several hundred along river 18/2; elsewhere 3 at Machan 21/2. Seen daily at Kosi where c10000 19/2. Seen daily at Kosi; peak of c50 at the barrage 19/2.

A scarce species. c40 along Kosi River 18/2, with c15 on 19/2. Seen daily at Kosi where present in 'hundreds'; otherwise 10+ Gaida 23/2. Seen daily at Kosi; max <50 on 19/2. 8 Kosi barrage 19/2, with 5 on 20/2. Only at Kosi barrage where peak of 30+ on 19/2.

Only at Kosi barrage where max. 12 on 19/2 and 5+ 20/2.

Seen daily at Kosi. Max 30+ on 19/2. Kosi 19-20/2. Max 10 at barrage 19/2. Present at Kosi 17-19/2, with peak count 8 on 19/2. Also seen daily at Gaida 22-24/2 with max of 6 on 22/2. Only at Chitwan, where 2 Machan 21/2, one Gaida 23/2 and 3 Gaida 24/2.

Counts of 4 at Kosi 19/2 and 3 on 20/2: single at Gaida 23/2. One seen from the dug-out canoes at Gaida on 23/2 was the only record. Seen daily. Locally abundant in towns 4 from raft ride along Kosi River 18/2, with single adult there 19/2. Singles on 16/2 (Godaveri) & 17/2. Female Kosi camp 17/2. One perched, Nagajung 15/2. Singles on 15/2 (Nagajung); 16/2 (Phulchowki); 18/2 (Kosi) and 23/2 (Gaida). Two seen Kosi 19/2. Singles at Nagajung 15/2; Kosi 19/2 and Hetauda (Rapti River) 22/2. 5+ Nagajung 15/2: 5+ Biratnagar-Kosi 17/2; singles at Kosi 19-20/2. 1 at roadside 20/2; 1 at Gaida 23/2. Distant bird Nagajung 15/2; sub-ad. Kosi 18/2. Noted daily at Chitwan with peak day count 6+ on 23/2. Good views of adult pale morph in roadside forest en route to Chitwan 20/2. [A juv. bird seen from rafts on Kosi river 18/2 identified as this sp. by those who had closest views] 2+ Nagajung 15/2: c10-Biratnagar-Kosi (including 4+ passing below our aircraft just prior to landing!); 3+ en route Kosi to Chitwan 20/2. 2 Nagajung 15/2. 2 records: 1 near Biratnagar 17/2; 1 just outside Chitwan NP (Gaida) 22/2. Fine adult Kosi River 18-19/2. Single dark phase nr. Gaida 22/2. Scarce and localised resident. Adult perched at riverside, Gaida 23/2. Kosi 18-20/2, with peak day count 4 on 19/2; elsewhere 3 Gaida 23/2. Kosi 18-20/2, with peak day count c20 on 19/2; 3+ Bharatpur-Kathmandu 24/2. Recorded most days from 17/2. Most numerous en route Kosi-Chitwan 20/2. Towards the end of the trip it became apparent that there had been some hitherto unrealised confusion over the use of the word 'Indian' to describe both the Long-billed (Gyps indicus) and Indian Griffon Vultures. Though both species were seen numbers remain somewhat confused...

2 calling just outside bedroom Hotel Himalaya, Kathmandu 15/2 (BC, PK). Single birds at Godaveri 16/2; Machan 21/2 and Gaida 22/2. Two seen Kosi 19/2 and Gaida 24/2.

Total of 16 seen between 17-24/2. Bird heard calling at Machan 20-21/2 (TRG); Up to 3 present at Gaida lodge 22-24/2.

Male & female flushed beside path by CRK, then stalked and photographed at close range, Gaida 23/2.

Up to 2 seen and heard Gaida lodge at dusk 22/2.

Seen most days from 17/2. Common en route Kosi-Chitwan 20/2.

Seen daily at Kosi, with max day count 5 on 19/2.
